





The Montjuïc Cable Car\* links the Funicular station with the peak of the Montjuïc mountain, through a 750 metre journey by air. Look down on the whole city while you ascend to Montjuïc Castle. From their updated cabins, you will recognise the most emblematic buildings of Barcelona, like the Sagrada Familia or Glòries, and you will enjoy wonderful views of the port.


